FIRST GENERATION OF TALBOTTS* IN AMERICA**

RICHARD TALBOTT - Planter, December 10, 1636, bought Poplar Knowle, a plantation on West River, Anne Arundel Co., Maryland, thenceforth made it his home. Married Elizabeth Ewen.

Of his parents or age, of any former residence, occupation or associates, of his political or religious views, nothing has been learned. With the exception of his offspring, nothing has been learned of any of his kindred. But slight mention has been made of him in any of the Maryland records. We have from them the knowledge that he was a landholder, that he married the daughter of a neighboring planter, and his will.

The plantation on which he settled, on the northwest bank of West River, and extending about a mile inland (near the Town of Galesville, a landing of the Chesapeake Bay steamboats, and now divided by the road leading to it), contained two hundred and sixty acres, and had been laid out four years earlier by John Brown, Christopher Rowles and Richard Moseby, planters. It was between two branches (then called Brown's and Bachelor's branches) of the river, and adjoined the plantation of Major Richard Ewen, one of the leaders of the Puritan Party in Maryland. The neighborhood was but little south of the center of the Puritan Colony, whose members, some exiled from Virginia, some coming directly from the Mother Country, had settled on the unoccupied lands hereabout (bounding on the bay and its tributaries) and with no neighbors but the Indians, in 1649 and the years following, had since steadily grown in numbers and influence.

MAJOR EWEN - Father of Richard Talbott's wife, for years served as a member of the Board of Commissioners which controlled the affairs of the Colony; at nearly every General Assembly, he was one of the representatives of his County; and twice or oftener, was Speaker of the House of Burgesses. He was Sheriff of the County, 1664-1665; his duties as an Officer of the Militia were during five years so exacting that he was obliged to decline (after the restoration of Lord Baltimore's government) the position of a Commissioner of Anne Arundel County. He was perhaps a member of the Governor's Council at the time of his death. He was survived by a widow and five children - the oldest, Elizabeth Ewen, who married Richard Talbott.

SECOND GENERATION

Issue of Richard and Elizabeth (Ewen) Talbott, all but the first probably born at Poplar Knowle.

RICHARD TALBOTT, the founder, died about 1663.

His widow, Elizabeth Ewen Talbott, married in 1667, William Richardson, of West River, minister of Society of Friends.

In 1674 he addressed a letter to George Fox, England, in behalf of West River Friends.

William Penn in his visit to Maryland in 1682, visited the home of William

Richardson, on West River, from which in company of Lord and Lady Baltimore, all proceeded to the yearly Friends' Meeting at Tredhaven, in Talbott County. Many of the male descendents emigrated to Virginia, the Carolinas, Kentucky and Tennessee. They had seven children. She died in 1703 or 1704.

JOHN TALBOTT - was born probably at Poplar Knowle, 1660. His father bequeathed to him one-half of Talbott's Ridge, on the north side of West River, which he sold thirty years afterwards to one of his half brothers. The half of Poplar Knowle and the half of Talbott's Timber Neck which he inherited after the death of his brother, Richard Talbott, some years later, passed into the possession of his brother, Edward Talbott. Probably a few years after this brother's death, he married Sarah, only daughter of John and Sara (Thomas) Mears, of the Clifts, Calvert County, and great-granddaughter of John Mears, who seems to have served in the British Navy 1632-7, on the same vessel with her great granduncle, Thomas Rice.

Sarah Mears Talbott was born August 4, 1673. Her parents died within a short time of each other, her mother first, early in 1675; and she was probably brought up by her Aunt Sarah Mears, wife of John Homewood, who had a plantation in Calvert County, adjoining one, and probably near another, she inherited from her father, Sarah Mears' property descended to her children. Some acres of it called Expectation.

The Birckheads were Friends and came from Bristol, England.

THOMAS TALBOTT BRAND son of Joseph C. and Lavinia Talbott Brand, was born in
Mechanicsburg, Ohio, January 28, 1835. He lived on his father's farm at Buck Creek,
Union Township, Champaign County, Ohio as a boy. One of the first volunteers in the
Civil War, he was a member of the 2nd Ohio Volunteer Infantry, volunteering April 17,
1861, and resigning from the Ohio Company to enter the Regular Army, he was made a First
Lieutenant of the 18th Regiment, United States Infantry. Saw service in the Army of
the Cumberland and the Army of Tennessee; was wounded in his left arm at Chickamauga
and thereafter served as mustering and disbursing Officer. Was breveted a Major and
retired December 1, 1866. By Act of Congress, April 23, 1904, he was made a Major
in the United States Army.

Mr. Brand served with Wells Fargo Company for some years. He married Eliza C. (Nettie)
Warnock, daughter of Rev. David Warnock.

WILLIAM AUGUSTUS BRAND - Son of Joseph C. and Lavinia Talbott Brand born at Buck Creek,
Union Township, Champaign County, Ohio, July 9, 1837 and died in Urbana, May 14, 1879.
He moved to Urbana as a small boy, was educated in Urbana Public Schools, Ohio Wesleyan
University and graduated from Cincinnati Law School in 1858. He married Frances Saxton,
daughter of Joshua Saxton.

He left with the Ohio Volunteer Infantry Company G, January 17, 1862, and saw three
years service in the Civil War. His letters to the Citizen and Gazette describing Camp
Life and Battles were eagerly read. He wrote under the pen name of D. N. Arbaw (his
name spelled backwards). In 1865 and until 1879 he was half owner of the Citizen and
Gazette with Joshua Saxton; Postmaster of Urbana, January 1878 to May 14, 1879 - W. A.
Brand Post Grand Army of the Republic was organized in the 80's after his death.

Joseph Brand Whitlock was Mayor of Toledo, Ohio, United States Ambassador to Belgium during World War 1, earned the affection of the Belgians by aiding them in World War 1, in preventing the Germans from destroying Brussels; remained in Belgium during the War, representing the interests of many Countries besides the United States; toured the United States with King Albert, Belgium, after World War 1. The Avenue "Brand Whitlock" in Brussels is named for him. He was a distinguished writer of fiction, history and biography.

JOHN FRANCIS BRAND - born June 18, 1848, died October 14, 1919. Son of Joseph Carter and Lavinia Talbott Brand, born at Buck Creek, Union Township, Champaign County, Ohio. Lived in Urbana after his third year. Educated in Urbana Public Schools and Urbana University. In 1863, when he was only 15 years old, he was Assistant Engineer of the Atlantic and Great Western Railway (Erie). a year later, though too young to enlist, he went to the field in the Civil War, serving as a clerk in the Commissary Department, until the close of the Civil War. He liked to tell of carrying the first basket of food to the southern soldiers at the Appomatox surrender. He saw service in Virginia and Georgia. After the Civil War, he was compositor at the Citizen and Gazette. From 1879 to 1887, he was in the retail grocery business in Urbana and Bellefontaine.

In 1887 with Mr. W. H. Marvin, he established the W. H. Marvin Wholesale Grocery. He retired in 1907, retaining an interest in the business.

From 1907 until his death, he was General Agent and President of the Western Mutual Fire Insurance Company of Urbana; at the time of his death, he was President of the Ohio Mutual Insurance Association; Vice President and Director, Champaign National Bank; Director, Urbana Telephone Company; President of Brand Ross, Insurance.

Mr. Brand was a member of Grace Methodist Episcopal Church, and for many years taught the Men's Class of that Church.

He was a great friend of young men, and no boy ever asked help of him in vain - he kept a fund active to help start boys on their careers. Some of these boys became very influential men, and loved to come back to him in gratitude.

NINTH GENERATION

CHARLES BRAND - Son of John Francis and Fannie Elizabeth Brand, born Urbana, November 1, 1871. Educated in Urbana Public Schools and Ohio Wesleyan University. A grocer in Richwood, Ohio; later Superintendent of Urbana Water Works Co. In 1892 he became associated with the W. H. Marvin Co., retiring from that Company in 1912, but retaining an interest in the firm.

Mr. Brand bought his first farm in 1894, the "Cable Farm" which had been owned by his grandfather, Joseph C. Brand. He added to his farm holdings until he possessed 6400 A. of Champaign and Logan County land. Known as a successful and keen business man and farmer.

He married Louise Jamieson Vance (born July 13, 1872 died 1948) October 23, 1894, and two children were born to them. Mr. Brand was a member of Grace Methodist Episcopal Church; served as Chairman of the Chautauqua Association; in the First World War put on the Red Cross Drive, when a hen contributed an egg during an auction in the Public Square. The egg was sold and resold, until the final price of the Red Cross Egg was \$30,000.00.

Charles Brand was an Urbana Councilman, served in the Ohio legislature; and for twelve years in the Congress of the United States.

Charles Brand married Mrs. Gwelda McCracken, April 7, 1951, and they moved to Melbourne Florida. Mr. Brand engaged in the Real Estate business there, building several business blocks.

C. has traveled extensively for this Bank, dealing with heads of states of all the free Countries of the world. Chairman of the Board W. H. Marvin Company, Urbana, Ohio from 1958.

Chairman Draftees Association, World War I; President, Kiwanis Club; Director, Champaign National Bank; Western Mutual Fire Insurance Company; Brand-Neer Insurance Company; and President of that Company; Director Red Cross; President Mercy Memorial Hospital Association; Member of First Presbyterian Church, on the Board of Elders, Board of Trustees, and President of the Congregation. A branch of the family, the Talbots of Malahide, which has possessed its castle and lordship on the seacoast near Dublin, Ireland, for nearly 700 years, has continued to bear the original arms. He married March 29, 1810, Margaret, daughter of *Major William and Rebecca (Harris) Hickman, of Calvert County, Maryland. She died March 12, 1823. John Talbott married again August 23, 1824, Pamela Beall. John Talbott died January 10, 1861.
